One day I was watching news about housing needs in Ottawa. While I was going through the City of Ottawa website, I saw Habitat for Humanity listed. After reviewing the homeownership program criteria, I was ecstatic to realize I qualified. It felt like I won the lottery when I was accepted into the Homeownership Program!

Having a home will change everything for my children. We'll have the stability, the security, and the time to do many things like focus on my children's education, their extracurriculars and being part of a community. We can grow a garden and have the space to get a pet. My kids will be able to say to their friends "we're going home" instead of "we're going to the apartment." Things like that seem small but will have a profound impact on our family. There are no other programs like Habitat out there, trust me I've checked.
